
Let's Talk - A Word from Pastor Mary Maaga mjzmaaga@yahoo.com 530-417-6584

During this forty-day season of Lent, we have received gifts to help in focusing our journey to the Cross and Empty Tomb.

Ash Wednesday – "sack cloth" to represent our sorrow over the ways our disobedience grieves the heart of God

First Sunday of Lent – mirror to represent our willingness to reflect on our behavior and our commitment to praying for ourself

Second Sunday of Lent – sheep to represent our willingness to follow the Good Shepherd and do for vulnerable people what He has called us to do

Third Sunday of Lent – a scented cloth to remind us of God's tender care

Fourth Sunday of Lent – a nail to remind us of the suffering of Christ and what He taught us from the Cross: forgiveness, salvation, love, atonement, suffering, victory, hope

Fifth Sunday of Lent – a rock to symbolize the hard reality of grief, and Jesus Christ the cornerstone upon which our lives of faith are built


Bright Sunday, also known as Holy Humor Sunday, April 16

<u>The Work of the Church – How</u> Our Church Works

As most of you know by now the United Methodist Church is splitting over the issue of whether to accept lesbian, gay,

bisexual, and transgender people into the full life of the Church, including as ordained Pastors. As a way to grow myself in the midst of this heartbreaking time for the United Methodist Church, which saved my life when I was in my 20s, I entered into a correspondence with a theologically conservative colleague of mine. I wanted to understand his point of view and have him understand mine. Here is another excerpt from what I wrote him:

Christ's saving grace is the only thing that keeps me from surrendering to despair when I sin. For me, that's what's at the heart of my desire for total inclusion of all people in the United Methodist Church: my experience that without the Lord I would die from shame and unbridled sin. What do people do who don't have a relationship with Jesus Christ? This is what keeps me up at night, thinking that there are lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender people who struggle with spiritual and emotional issues unrelated to their sexual orientation that they have no relief from because the Church has not welcomed them into a relationship of trust and mutual respect. Being part of the Body of Christ can be hard. But in Churches we are challenged to love one another in spite of differences, we are put to work, we begin to mature in our understanding of God, and we are held accountable. I know for me all these together eventually birthed a disciple. Why would we deny anyone this opportunity based upon sexual or gender orientation?

Next week I will write my last article on this topic for now. Please feel free to text or email me any questions that I can answer in these articles. In May we will have a round table discussion for those who are interested in talking more about our denomination's split and the reasons for it.

The craft for this meeting will be painting and decorating wooden crosses with a scripture on them, so please dress kids in practical play clothes. We have gray G.U.M.C. T-shirts they can wear over their clothes to prevent paint staining, but things can get messy!

Our last Sunday school meeting brought two new boys, so we have 16 different kids who have visited or attended now, AND our church member, Mary Blackwell is now a certified teacher, so we are closer to holding Sunday school twice each month instead of only once. God's blessings are always apparent. Thank you, God and Mary B.!

When you come upstairs, peek into the Sunday school room to see the curtain valance that will be completed this coming week to brighten our little room even more. We still need a 40" x 40" sturdy bookcase for that room. If you have one in decent shape we could really use it for books for the kids upstairs.

With some musical instruments recently found in church cupboards by Mona Stratton and Pastor Mary, we will once again practice the second verse to "Jesus Loves Me". Different children appear each time in our Sunday school so not all of them have learned it each time. Practice makes perfect, and one of these Sundays the children will sing it for the congregation.

Thank you to all who are helping in any way. There are now too many of you to mention, but God will bless you, and you are providing a much-needed ministry to these big and little inquiring minds and busy fingers.
