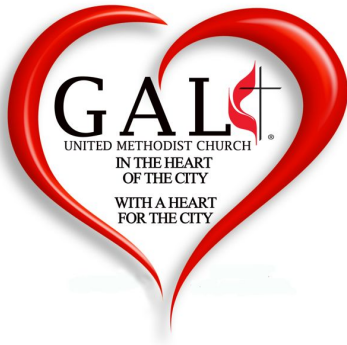

If you haven't noticed yet - the Sunshine Food Pantry is now its own entity. What that means is we are becoming independent from Galt UMC. Our full official title is: Sunshine Food Pantry and Resource Center, Inc. A California Nonprofit Corporation. Our nonprofit 501c3 number has been applied for.

We are in the process of creating our own record keeping and financial record systems. As such, The Pantry now has two checking accounts - Sunshine Food Pantry - and - Sunshine Food Pantry Building Fund. Interested persons can now make monetary donations direct to our own address:

A year ago it became clear to the Exploratory Committee that The Pantry would need to become independent from Galt UMC in order to qualify for government grants and we were correct in that assumption. Our first large grant of \$200,000 came from County Supervisor Don Nottoli. To date, several other individual donors have come forward.

This being a corporation, the organization is governed by a Board of Directors. At this time, we have a Board of five directors: Faye Gaines, CEO; Earl Arrants, Chief Finance Officer; Linda Seashore, Secretary; Doug Gibson, Board Member; Mary Maaga, Board Member. Our Legal Advisor is Len Reynoso. Each Board Member has a copy of the Corporation Bylaws. A Building Committee has been formed under the direction of David Herburger. A Building Fund Committee is headed by Mark King. A Pantry website is in the planning stages with an *online giving* component. Things are moving along. I'm sure more announcements will be forthcoming.

Our Lunch Bunch continually searches for interesting place to dine each month. Recently a new place opened in the closed FLAMES Restaurant in the Save Mart Center. Eager to try it out, Denny and Betty Yoder, Alan and Michele Weinel, and I headed to **Kabobs & Gyros**, 1067 C Street, #132 for lunch last week.

Not much has changed on the inside of the room, However, we were impressed with the colorful variety on the printed menu. It gave a very good graphic picture of the items such as kabobs, gyros, wraps, donairs, bowls, and an interesting looking Afghani burger. I later found out the ethnic menu items highlight Greek/Mediterranean cuisine.

We were new to the place so each person ordered a different menu item. One diner ordered a gyro (8.99). All Gyros are served w/lettuce, tomato, onions, Garlic sauce, tzatziki sauce, and pita bread. They can be ordered with chicken, beef, lamb, or veggie.

Kabobs & Gyros

Two of the other diners ordered a donair. It looks sort of like a Gyro, but slightly flattened. They are served with lettuce, cucumber, tomato, onions, tabuli, black olives, jalapeño, Garlic sauce and pita bread.

One diner ordered a strange looking thing called the Afghani burger (\$8.99). The description says: All Afghani burgers wrapped with pita bread, french fries, and veggies. It's shaped like a tri-cornered cornucopia with the fries poked inside. The diner remarked how different it was. It comes with chicken or sausage burger.

After much decision making, I chose the beef/lamb platter (\$12.99). The thin meat strips were served on a bed of rice, along with hummus, salad, yogurt dressing, and pita bread. For me it was very tasty except it was too much for lunch. I was able to finish the take home for dinner that night.

Other items on the menu are tabuli salad, or Greek salad, (4.99). Beverages are 3.99 to 1.99. A child's menu includes chicken nuggets.

We five diners gave Kabobs & Gyros a thumbs up and felt it was worth another visit. We will let you make up your own mind when the Lunch Bunch meets this coming Thursday, August 4, at 11:30. See you there.

- The following is our Conference Communication about our Oak Fire Response

As if we needed a reminder, we are well into wildfire season. Thousands of evacuees of the Oak Fire in Mariposa County need our prayers and support.

Pastor Mark Buenafe of Mariposa UMC reports, "While several outlying communities have been impacted, the main town of Mariposa has been spared." As containment creeps up, we are encouraged that the damage will be limited. But, nonetheless, several dozen families have lost their homes, and sadly more losses are expected.

The immediate priority is the safety and care of everyone in evacuation shelters and temporary locations. There are two evacuated families staying at the Mariposa church. The challenge is food and water for all the impacted people and pets. Many local restaurants and organizations are rallying to meet the need.

Your Cal-Nev Conference Disaster Response Ministry is primed and ready to deploy once there is sufficient containment and the county is ready for us. We will be staffing the Local Assistance Center (LAC) providing evacuees and survivors with gift cards, hygiene kits and other resources. If nothing else, our ministry of presence offers a "willing ear." Talking about the current reality always helps.

Once recovery starts, we will offer survivors a variety of services and support. This might include assistance with temporary housing, food, clothing, and household necessities. Our trained Early Response Team (ERT) members can help with cleanup and retrieving personal items.

If you are interested in helping, the most useful thing is a donation to our Conference Disaster Response Fund.
