Blue Christmas, also known as The Longest Night, is a Christmas Season Worship Service that creates space for people who are grieving or going through any kind of hard time to "celebrate" Christmas without having to fake how we actually feel. I remember attending a Blue Christmas the year my husband died. He had passed in October and was I doing my level best to make Christmas special for my young children. That meant wearing my colorful sweaters, decorating the house, baking cookies, and wrapping presents - and also crying some when the kids were at school. I felt

crazy. People would ask how I was doing, and I honestly didn't know. "Okay, I guess" was my standard reply. I would look at the nativity figurines in my home and ask, "Where are You God?" A very faithful Christian woman guessed correctly that God felt very far away and invited me to come to The Longest Night service they were having at her Church. I went with no expectations: just planning to sit and enjoy quiet music and light a candle for Boikanyo. I received so much more than I expected - my grief didn't go away, but God felt nearer and that helped a lot. Hope was born that night. If you are feeling blue this Christmas, for any

reason, I encourage you to come to our Blue Christmas at Galt UMC this year: 5pm on Wednesday, December 21st, which is the longest



For the next two Sundays and on Christmas Eve we are collecting a special offering for Heifer Project. What is Heifer





incomes so families can afford nutritious food, shelter, clean water, access to health care and a safe environment to raise their children. How is this done? By sending animals into communities that have been given resources for the maintenance and reproduction of these animals. Much of Heifer Project's

work takes place in the Americas, including the United States; East Africa; and the poorest countries of Asia. Please learn more by logging on to heifer.org – there you will find inspiring stories and lots more information.

You can contribute to Heifer Project by writing a check to Galt UMC and putting Heifer Project in the notation, or you can take a colorful envelope as you enter the Sanctuary and put cash in it. On Christmas Eve whatever is given toward the offering will go to Heifer Project as well. Here's something FUN about our offering. WE GET TO DECIDE WHAT "ANIMAL" WE PURCHASE. For example, if we raise \$1000 then we can purchase a "mating pair of cattle"; for \$5000 we can gift a whole ARK of pairs of animals that includes cows, oxen, sheep, pigs, beehives, goats, chicks, rabbits, etc.; and any amount we send can be designated toward purchasing equipment and non-toxic fertilizers for access to clean water. Once we know our total offering we will take a "straw poll" (get it, cows, straw??) in early January during Worship and decide what we will buy.

The 20-dollar bill reminisced about its travels all over the country.


