

<u>The Work of the Church – How Our</u> <u>Church Works by Pastor Mary</u>

At a Special Church Conference on May 12, 2022 the Building Committee for the Sunshine Food Pantry & Resource Center, Inc. was established with David Herburger as its chair. What is a Special Church Conference, you ask?

It is a meeting called by the District Superintendent of the United Methodist Church, at our request, to make decisions that will have a big impact on future mission and ministries. At this same meeting the by-laws that established the Sunshine Food Pantry & Resource Center, Inc. as its own 501(c)3 non-profit charity were also adopted. One of the things about being United Methodist is that we are a "connectional" system, which means Galt UMC functions as one part of a whole. In other words, we have to keep the whole Methodist hierarchy in the loop when big decisions get made. These decisions were made last year so that American Rescue Plan Act monies that were designated for community non-profits, but not Churches, could be accessed by our food pantry. And, guess what, this effort paid off! We received a \$200,000 grant from Sacramento County, advocated for by Supervisor Don Nottoli, toward the construction of our food pantry building. Committee estimates that we will need a million dollars to build a state of the art building that will minimize the wear and tear on volunteers, create a place out of the elements for our patrons, and include solar panels, food recovery capability, and a space where our patrons can be connected up with other agencies that can help with resources and services. Right here! Right next to our Galt UMC parking lot! We are nearly halfway there, with our goal being to complete fundraising by October of this year. How is that possible? PRAYER, of course! Also, grant writing, fundraisers, and generous individual donors. If you have questions about any of this, feel free to ask me, or David Herburger (916-712-2815), or any of the other members of the Building Committee: Faye Gaines, Sandie Benadum, Leesa Klotz, Alan Weinel. Recently Mark King, our fundraising chair, and Pearl Silva, Chief Financial Officer for the Sunshine Food Pantry & Resource Center, Inc. have also been attending the Building Committee since we can't build anything until we have all the money to spend! We are determined to build this debt free with all money raised up front. Did I mention we need prayer???
