What a rich Christmas week we had at Galt UMC! I am still positively abuzz with the power of it all: the JOY of our 4th Sunday of Advent, the PROFOUND DEPTH of our Blue Christmas, the LOVE & LIGHT of Christmas Eve, the WARMTH & CLOSENESS of Christmas Day. (We had such a wonderful time Christmas morning, that we will make that an annual tradition, even when Christmas doesn't fall on a Sunday.) And now we are amid the Twelve Days of Christmas that ends on Epiphany.
