

Won't say it was fun generating our Galt UMC statistics for 2022 to give to the United Methodist Conference, but I WILL say that the reality they reflect is worth celebrating! First, our worship attendance has grown this past year. This is a trend that is bound to continue in 2023 given the addition of a second worship every week at Bruceville Point, and given the response we are getting from visitors that return, some of whom have officially joined, and even moved into leadership positions.

Second, all the statistics that indicate vitality in a local Church are up: giving is up; numbers of people involved in groups, committees, and/or volunteering is up. Third, number of hours that are being spent in mission and ministry per member is up.

The only statistical number that is down is our current official membership: 106, down from 113. Though we took in more members in 2022 than we lost to death, transfer, or withdrawal, we removed from our official membership rolls by action of Charge Conference last October, our brothers and sisters in Christ from Isleton UMC who were transferred into Galt UMC in 2019 – we knew even as they were transferred to us, that most would be unlikely to make the dangerous drive, and would find Church homes in non-United Methodist Churches in their own community. (We are blessed that Lynne Hasz is the exception and has made her Church home with us!)



Attendance and Offering Report

Statistics tell only part of the truth. Feeling tells the rest. How do you feel when you walk into our sanctuary? How do you feel when you arrive for Worship, or Quilt Club, or Bible Study, or Women's Group, or to volunteer for the Food Pantry? I can only guess by the smile on your faces and the warmth of your hugs that you feel good. Even the energy at our Committees is mostly good and positive, even as we grapple with problems needing to be solved. I know how I feel: like I am the most blessed pastor in the California-Nevada Conference of the United Methodist Church. <u>The Work of the Church – How Our</u> Church Works by Pastor Mary

Last week I wrote about how Methodists understand Biblical authorship to be illumined by the Holy Spirit. This is different than Churches that believe all Scripture is the inerrant words of God. In the Methodist

tradition there is an acceptance that human beings - even when they are deeply faithful and inspired by God's Spirit - will inevitably reflect the limitations of the culture in which they live. This becomes particularly clear with regard to race and slavery, the role of women in the Church, and the current controversy around whether our lesbian and gay brothers and sisters are to be fully embraced within the Christian So, why were the Methodists at the forefront of abolition, and now at the forefront of movements for racial equality and inclusion? Why were the Methodists the first denomination to ordain women? And on what basis is there a justification for the full inclusion of homosexuals in the life of the Church? We need look no further than the theological section of our most recent Book of Discipline, page 84: We interpret individual texts in light of their place in the Bible as a whole. We are aided by scholarly inquiry and personal insight under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The motto of the United Methodist Church - OPEN HEART, OPEN MINDS, OPEN **DOORS** - is a reflection of this willingness to INQUIRE. More on this next week.
