This past week in our study of the fifth chapter of James at our Tuesday morning Bible Study, we talked a lot about money. Jesus, Paul, James and the other early Church leaders understood how tempting it is to make money a focus over God. All warned of the dangers, with Jesus proclaiming, "You cannot serve God and wealth." (Matthew 6:24) When God is the center of our life and the building of God's kingdom our purpose, then our money can become an instrument of blessing for our neighbor, as well as a necessary vehicle for self-care. John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, was concerned toward the end of his life that Methodists were becoming more dependent on money for security than they

were upon God. In a famous sermon preached in 1759 called "The Use of Money" Wesley encouraged Christians to "earn all we can" through diligent work; "save all we can" by giving up extravagant indulgences; and "give all we can" to those who have less. He wrote, *I am not afraid that the people called Methodists should ever cease to exist.... But I am afraid, lest they should only exist as a dead sect, having the form of religion without the power.* Wesley believed that "the power" was based in total dependence on God over money,

with our relationship with money reflecting that dependence on God. Thus, we have money to give away because we are disciplined in our employment and frugal in our expenditures.

But Pastor Mary, is Wesley saying we should never do anything fun or go on any adventures? Of course not! What he is saying is that money, like time, and like our very lives, belongs to God. All of it.



Jesus Christ gave us the Great Commandment to love God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind, and our neighbor as ourselves. God, neighbor, self. It is up to each one of us to

decide how much our neighbor gets and how much we keep for ourselves. Wesley considered how much Christians give our neighbor to be THE thing that sets us apart from the world. Lots to ponder and pray over, yes??



"Memories?" Jeff asked.


