On the mornings when it isn't raining, I love to do my devotions on the back patio while throwing a ball for Freya. Part of my devotions is Scripture and written prayers I have come to love over the years, which I recite as I play ball; part is prayers for all of you, starting with the prayer chain and then continuing on to whoever/whatever the Lord lays on my heart. Then comes the part I find the most challenging: LISTENING. On the Second Sunday of Lent we received a sheep to remind us to listen to the voice of the Good Shepherd and follow Him. I am a really good talker, as any of you who come to Worship or Bible Study can attest! But I am not always a very good listener. As a New Year's Resolution this year I challenged myself to become a better

listener. When I feel God urging me to change for the better, I know the best way to do that is to take on a daily discipline. So, to become a better listener, I decided to add a listening practice to the end of my devotions. For example, this morning I heard roosters crow, cows low, trains chug, geese honk, many different birds chirp, the sliding door of a neighbor, a bathroom door shut within my house, Freya's panting, the "thwack" of the ball as she caught it. Then I listened more deeply. I heard my heart beat, then my heart sing in gratitude to God – the words took shape in my throat and mouth as I quietly sang the doxology. Then I heard the still, small voice of God filling my soul with grace. When I listen deeply, I feel the connection, whether I am listening to nature, to a person, or to God. Listen. Feel. Connect. That's become the heart of this year's Lenten journey for me.

This past week we talked about the difference between how people in the ancient world

understood love and romance versus now. In the ancient world the most important qualities one looked for in a potential spouse was: love of God; love of community (neighbor); love of self, in terms of keeping oneself honorable and above reproach. Romantic love for your spouse might then grow, but even if it didn't your marriage would be a blessing to your community. This is the understanding of marriage at play as Ruth meets Boaz, and as Ruth's mother-in-law Naomi advocates for their union. Come see what happens next! ### <u>The Work of the Church – How Our Church</u> <u>Works by Pastor Mary</u>

Last week I began writing about the split that is taking place now in the United Methodist Church. As with all Church splits – from the controversy between Paul and the Jerusalem Church over circumcision to the current one over the full inclusion of all sexual orientations

- the heart of the matter always is WHO KNOWS GOD'S WILL BEST. Because there are several sources for determining God's will in any given situation, Christians of deep faith can arrive at different Those Christians who believe in the conclusions. primacy of the words of Scripture tend to be more politically and socially conservative, including the Jerusalem Church in the first century that wanted to follow the laws of the Old Testament alongside faith in Jesus Christ. Those Christians who believe in the primacy of the Holy Spirit in interpreting words of Scripture, including Paul in the first century who replaced the law with grace through faith in Jesus Christ, tend to be more inclusive, as Paul was with gentiles.

What is clear to me is that there is a desire to know the will of God and do what pleases God on the part of those who are staying in the United Methodist Church <u>and</u> on the part of those who are leaving to join the Global Methodist Church. I don't question anyone's faith. To be honest I am relieved that the split is finally upon us. It means both sides can go about doing the work of God in the world without continuing to use untold amount of energy and financial resources in fighting with one another. Sometimes it really is better for the children when a divorce happens.

How will this impact the California-Nevada Conference that Galt UMC is a part of? Not much. While 400 Churches in Texas have voted to leave the UMC, only 9 in our Conference have entered the process to leave. The General Conference of the UMC offered local Churches a path out of the United Methodist Church with their church buildings and property if they got approval from two-thirds of their congregation and pay a financial renumeration set by each Conference's Board of Trustees to cover clergy pension liabilities and compensation for the property, which in our Conference was set at 20% of property value. Next week I will share a little more about what I think is at stake in the split. In May we will have an open meeting to discuss any questions that might arise for you as you read these articles.




A seven-year-old boy was sitting in church with his grandmother Church impatiently fidgeting while a long-Chuckles winded preacher went on and on.
