Though my family was not Christian, still we celebrated Easter every year in the conventional Easter Bunny kind of way. One year I received a baby chick for Easter – yep, a real live baby chick! This was the year my childhood dog had died, so I think the chick was a way for my parents – aka "The Easter Bunny" – to soothe my broken heart. I loved that little chick and was obsessed with imprinting myself onto it as its Mother: feeding it little mealy worms by hand, making sure it had plenty of fresh water to drink, placing it carefully in a cage with a blanket over it at night. But after a while I got busy with other things and

Easter Chick eventually grew into a chicken. At that point I was doing the bare minimum to sustain the chicken's life. I changed its water every morning and would pick up the cage and put it on the grass. I no longer played with my Easter Chick. What had started out as affection, even love, had now become a chore and a burden

One day I was bored and thought I would take Easter Chick out to play. But guess what?!?! The chicken had grown too large to get out of the cage. Instead of a place of safety, the cage had become the chicken's prison! What a moment of horror and shame that was for me! After crying many tears and asking Easter Chick to forgive me, I went to my big brother and asked if he could cut the cage to free the chicken. He did, and we took the chicken to a neighbor who had a large backyard for Easter Chick to live free.

This time of year, I always think of Easter Chick. I think how the sin that binds us so often starts as something we can move in and out of – until one day we can no longer get out of it. I think of Jesus Christ as the one with the metal shears that cuts us free of that which imprisons us. We are all Easter Chicks yearning to be free!

Pastor Mary has suggested that you keep these gifts in a special place in your home that you might reflect on the lessons they represent during the week. (If you missed a week, please ask Pastor Mary for any extras – or you can improvise your own item.)

Ash Wednesday – "sack cloth" to represent our sorrow over the ways our disobedience grieves the heart of God.

First Sunday of Lent – mirror to represent our willingness to reflect on our behavior and our commitment to praying for ourself.

Second Sunday of Lent – sheep to represent our willingness to follow the Good Shepherd and do for vulnerable people what He has called us to do

Third Sunday of Lent – a scented cloth to remind us of God's tender care.

Fourth Sunday of Lent – a nail to remind us of the suffering of Christ and what He taught us from the Cross: forgiveness, salvation, love, atonement, suffering, victory, hope.



<u>The Work of the Church – How Our</u> <u>Church Works by Pastor Mary</u>

The news media loves a conflict. Therefore you can be absolutely certain that as the split in our denomination continues to

grow, there will be news coverage. I have been writing these articles because I do not wish for you to be alarmed. Galt UMC will be unaffected by the split, as far as I can tell. Only a handful of small Churches in the Central Valley and Great Northern Districts of the California-Nevada Conference have decided to leave. However, when the news reports air, they are likely to focus on the United Methodist Churches in Texas and the South where huge numbers of local Churches are choosing to "disaffiliate." They go with my blessing, as I hope they will bless us as they depart. Lord knows there is plenty enough work to be done in this world by people with faith in Jesus Christ, and I have never been a believer in the idea that any one "flavor" of Christianity has all the answers. The point of contention that has caused some clergy and local Churches to leave the UMC is Paragraph 304.3 in our Book of Discipline that reads as follows: The practice of homosexuality is incompatible with Christian teaching. Therefore self-avowed practicing homosexuals are not to be certified as candidates, ordained as ministers, or appointed to serve in The United Methodist Church. What is more than a little confusing about the split in the UMC is that it is conservative Christians who AGREE with this paragraph who are leaving our denomination. Why? Because there has been unhappiness over the lack of strict enforcement of the paragraph. I am among many clergy in the Cal-Nev Annual Conference who have advocated to have this paragraph removed from the Book of Discipline. Next week I will share my theological and Scriptural reasons for wanting it removed. Please feel free to text or email me any questions that I can answer in these articles. In May we will have a round table discussion for those who are interested.
