Since starting to work at age 17 I have loved aspects of every job I've ever had. I had the desire in most cases to make a lifetime career out of where I was working whether it was Sacramento City Hall, the University of Stirling, youth ministries, appointments to local Churches, and so on. I even hoped at various points that my writing career or retreat leading or life coaching would be long term and defining professions. Here's the strange thing, though. #### The Work of the Church – How Our Church Works by Pastor Mary

This week I want to share with you the process through which a good idea can become a reality in a local United Methodist Church. Our case study will be one that your Galt UMC leaders are working on right now. As more visitors come to Worship at Galt, Church leaders have

received feedback that the unpredictability of the style of music is a barrier, plus by having musicians who are only with us on an occasional basis, we are not able to develop a choir program. First, Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) under the leadership of Colleen Hurley discussed this issue at a meeting and decided to appoint a member of SPRC to find out how much Churches in our area pay for a Sunday morning musician/Director of Music Ministries; then, Finance Committee under the leadership of Pearl Silva was asked informally whether our giving trend might support such a paid position, and whether SPRC should develop a job description. The Finance Committee's answer was yes. This is where we are right now. So what is the official process moving forward? 1) SPRC creates a job description and a proposed salary which they take to Finance; 2) Finance looks at the giving trend, plus the potential for our members supporting such a position with increased giving; 3) If Finance doesn't think it's financially feasible the process ends there. If Finance endorses the position, then it is carried by SPRC to Church Council which has the power to vote yes as is, yes with changes in the job description or salary proposed, or no. If no, then the process ends there. If yes, then SPRC will go about advertising the position, and the Finance Committee will go about educating the congregation as to what it will take in terms of giving to make the position sustainable. Prayer and spiritual discernment is a part of every step in the decision making. I love our United Methodist process because it involves a lot of people in decision making. We are better together!


