While we are blessed with spiritual and numerical growth at Galt UMC, there are distressing things happening in the California-Nevada Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, as well as our denomination in general throughout the nation and world. I want to invite you to stay after Worship at Galt UMC on Sunday, May 21 to discuss the decision to "disaffiliate" on the part of some United Methodist Churches over the issue of human sexuality, and to discuss any concerns you might have over the suspension of Bishop Minerva Carcano and the recent decision to bring her to ecclesiastical trial. Your Lav Member to Annual Conference Mercedes Diego and I will do everything we can to answer any questions you might have, but more importantly it will give you a chance to voice hopes and concerns about the future of our denomination. We are fortunate that in the California-Nevada Annual Conference of 370 Churches and ministries, only 6 local Churches have chosen to disaffiliate.


Each person contributed one or two items they had in their pantry, fridge or freezer and by the time we put it all together we had 2 large pots of delicious soup to share with all.

My favorite part of Stone Soup (besides eating it) is taking all the single donations of individuals and turning it into something significant that not only feeds many others, but also brings us together in fellowship. It reminds me of the work of the volunteers in the food pantry--they pull together donations from all over, whatever anyone can give, and the care and nourishment it provides is far more significant than any single item.

That's a total of 4 servings. If you make a dish that has leftovers, then you could box up 4 servings in 2 or 4 containers and freeze them. Or you could increase your meal by 4 servings and box and freeze that. Be sure to label it and add any special instructions if needed. Bring your frozen meals to Pastor Mary or myself the next time you plan to come to the church. Even if it is only on Sunday. There is a freezer in Pastor Mary's office. Two servings for one family would work if that is all you have. Just please be sure to mark the containers (scotch tape works) as to what it is. The SPRC had asked congregants to fill out a survey, asking what ministries held most value, and what ideas for new ministries in the future people have. The most popular ministries mentioned on the survey and during the meeting were the Bible studies, children's programs, outreach to Bruceville members, the quilt club. ministries that were suggested for the future were classes (such as a prayer class, book study, craft classes), more frequent Sunday school for children, and a youth group. A desire for an enhanced music program was expressed.

At the meeting, the question was posed: 'What feeds your soul here at Galt UMC?' Many people responded that this is a welcoming place, and that it feels like family-some touching examples were given. People appreciate the outreach that we do in the community. Spiritual growth was mentioned, including the sermons by Pastor Mary. Many people talked about wanting some more activities, particularly around meals. There is a desire to spend some more time together socializing. Some suggestions were a spaghetti feed, a men's BBQ, picnics in the park, a 'paint and sip' (non-alcoholic of course) event.
