During Worship our own Papa Earl Arrants will read us the Fable of the Stone Soup, complete with the lovely illustrations on the screen. Then our Lord's Lambs will go upstairs for their first Sunday School class in their own room! Following worship, we will have our own Stone Soup organized by Debra Herburger!

WHAT IS STONE SOUP? ? The first version of the Fable of the Stone Soup appeared in 1720. Two travelers come to a village seeking food. They do not want to be seen as beggars, so they put water and some stones in a big pot and invite the villagers to bring just a little something to add to the soup that all might eat together. The moral of this earliest version was: *On thousands of occasions, to get oneself out of a problem, a little spirit is necessary.* Over the centuries this story has been told to remind us of THE HOPE AND THE POWER AND THE STRENGTH OF A COMMUNITY COMING TOGETHER TO OVERCOME CHALLENGES THAT ARE TOO MUCH FOR ANY SINGLE PERSON TO DO ALONE.


