When I was a little girl Halloween was THE holiday! Imagine a night when people give away candy - FOR FREE - and you get the joy of wearing a costume! Our legs were starting to get tired, and I remember feeling relieved when my Mom said that we could only do one more block. We had saved the best for last. We were really worn out, but I convinced my sister to go to one last house. We made our way up to the top of the stairs toward a scary looking door with cobwebs and a giant spider. My sister bolted down the stairs like she had been shot out of a cannon! I ran after her - I had no other choice - we were tied together!
