

The Work of the Church – How Our Church Works by Pastor Mary

Once a year every local United Methodist Church has a meeting with our District Superintendent for him/her to evaluate the health of our Church and whether the current appointed pastor is a good fit or not.

As part of this meeting a "Charge Conference Booklet" is created that includes a "state of the Church" article by the pastor. This is what I wrote for our booklet this past week:

Need look no further than the minutes at the back of this booklet for the two special Church Conferences that Galt UMC held in the past 12 months, to see that the mission of the United Methodist Church to "make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world" is being enthusiastically fulfilled by the United Methodists of Galt, California! We are in the midst of pushing for an affordable housing project for seniors and veterans in our community that will make use of our two empty lots that we will sell to Christian Church Homes (CCH), a decision that was made at our October 14, 2021 Special Church Conference. It has been a year that required much grit and an abundance of patience, as the Holy Spirit put together the project God desires. I hope that by the time I write this report next year that ground will be broken. Even while we were on the roller coaster of CCH acquiring other lots to include with ours for the housing project, a Building Committee established at the Special Church Conference on May 12, 2022 moved ahead with fundraising for a building to house the Sunshine Food Pantry & Resource Center on the lot currently housing the Church Offices and storage shed. Last Friday we had a community kick-off event sponsored by the Galt chapter of Rotary attended by over one hundred people representing a dozen political offices, non-profits, and City commissions. Galt UMC is on the map as a beacon for unity and hope.

Bishop Beverly Shamana used to say "feet follow faith in action" and the enthusiasm felt at worship, in the work of our committees, and in our care for one another certainly demonstrates that at Galt UMC. Of special note are three groups that have gone above and beyond since our last Church Conference:

1. Our Trustees have accomplished necessary repairs and maintenance work on the Parsonage, on the parking lot, on the grounds of the Sanctuary and office, on the Sanctuary roof, AND in creating a Sunday School space out of a room that had been used for storage. Thank you Rob Seibel for your leadership of Trustees.

- 2. We have the potential for 14 children in our Children's Ministry program. These are the children and grandchildren of frequent worshipers. We are blessed that Madeline Powell has stepped up to organize a monthly program for our "Lord's Lambs". So far, we have had as many as 6 children participating. She has some help from adults but is looking for more.
- 3. With the pandemic loosening its grip we have returned to having coffee hour following worship. We are grateful to have coordinators for both Greeters (Sharon Drake) and Hospitality (Anne Albrecht). Their efforts are especially important since we are having visitors nearly every Sunday.

In the year to come we will focus on improving our financial reporting systems so that offerings and expenditures are transparent to every Church member. We are grateful that Pearl Silva has stepped up to lead this effort as newly appointed Finance Chair. Also in the year to come the Trustees will have their hands full with preparing the current "food closet" to house the Church Offices. That will be a big task requiring exactly the skill set that the continuing and new Trustees have, as well as lots of prayer and patience on the part of us all.

Every Sunday morning is an enthusiastic family reunion. Members of long standing are reaching out to visitors and newer members. Music is various depending on which of our hand full of occasional musicians are available. matter what, we know we can count on our beloved Papa Earl Arrants to play the organ. How grateful we are for this faithful disciple who gives of himself so freely for the building of the Kingdom of God. He continues to publish a newsletter WEEKLY to an enthusiastic readership. My prayer in 2023 is that God might bring us a musician or two who can make a weekly commitment to Galt UMC.

I experience joy in serving Galt UMC. Thank you for being the people that you are, redeemed by the Lord and sanctified by the Holy Spirit.
